Dachtober Fest, LLC was incorporated in 2009 for the purpose of promoting rescue, fostering, adoption and educating the public on the needs of our special Dachshund breed who are always in need of homes. We are committed to supporting rescue and non-profit organizations to continue to receive these dogs, get proper veterinary care, a great foster home and prepare them for a “final” adoption. Every month, these groups receive dogs from puppy mills, owner surrenders, shelter transfers and lost and found. In order to support the various non-profit organizations in Colorado, each year donations are designated to a group and/or different groups. September 2008 was the first year for this event and all proceeds went to Coast to Coast Dachshund Rescue, (CCDR). Around 250 humans attended along with 150 sweet Dachshunds. For September 2009, all proceeds went to the Denver Dumb Friends League and Buddy Center, (DDFL) with several vendors in attendance. Almost 450 humans and 250 Dachshunds including their furry friends attended the event. This was the first year we allowed non-Dachshunds or Doxie Friends, as we call them, all under 20 pounds. Since many Dachshund families are mixed with other small breeds, we wanted this to be a “family event”. Unfortunately large family dogs are not allowed. On September 25, 2010 the proceeds went to All Breed Rescue Network, Inc (ABRN). ABRN affiliated small dog rescue groups attended including; Japanese Chin Rescue, Rocky Mountain Yorkie Rescue and Colorado Pug Rescue with their adorable adoptable foster dogs. Over 250 small breeds (under 25 lbs.) and over 450 humans, 20 vendors and German dancers attended the event! ABRN and Ginger's Legacy have been chosen as the recipients for Colorado Dachtober Fest on Saturday, September 24, 2011.

The recipients of past and present Dachtober Fest, LLC are a non-profit organization with a 501(c)3 status. More information on Dachtober Fest's recipients can be found below.

 Coast to Coast Dachshund Rescue (CCDR) has representatives here in Colorado. They work tirelessly receiving, fostering and qualifying humans to make a good match for their rescued dachshund's forever home. Representatives and how to become a foster can be found on their website www.c2cdr.org.

 Denver Dumb Friends League (Quebec Shelter) & Buddy Center (Castle Rock) is another great organization, you can be placed on a Dachshund purebred list. When a Dachshund becomes available for adoption, they will call everyone on the list. This list is based on a first come first serves basis to meet and greet, and make a final adoption. Fostering is another venue to help the shelter and their dogs. The foster dog will come live with you on a limited time basis to help the dog possibly recover from surgery, or doesn't do well in a shelter, or help it socialize, etc. For more information, please check out their website www.ddfl.org.


 All Breed Rescue Network, Inc., (ABRN) began at the Denver Municipal Shelter in the winter of 1989 when one of their founders was helping a friend look for her lost dog. She was amazed to see so many unclaimed purebreds. She bought one, cleaned it up, had it neutered, and found it a home. She also tracked down other dog fanciers and told them about their breeds. Living close to the shelter, she dropped by once a week or so and let people know what was there. Little did she know! She met and joined forces with others already doing rescue for their breeds, then other area shelters began to be covered, and the network emerged. Incorporated in 1993, their purpose is to provide breed assistance, welfare, education and placement. They are recognized as an integral part of the animal welfare community in this state and work cooperatively with nearly every shelter, both public and private, to place dogs in breed-appropriate homes. 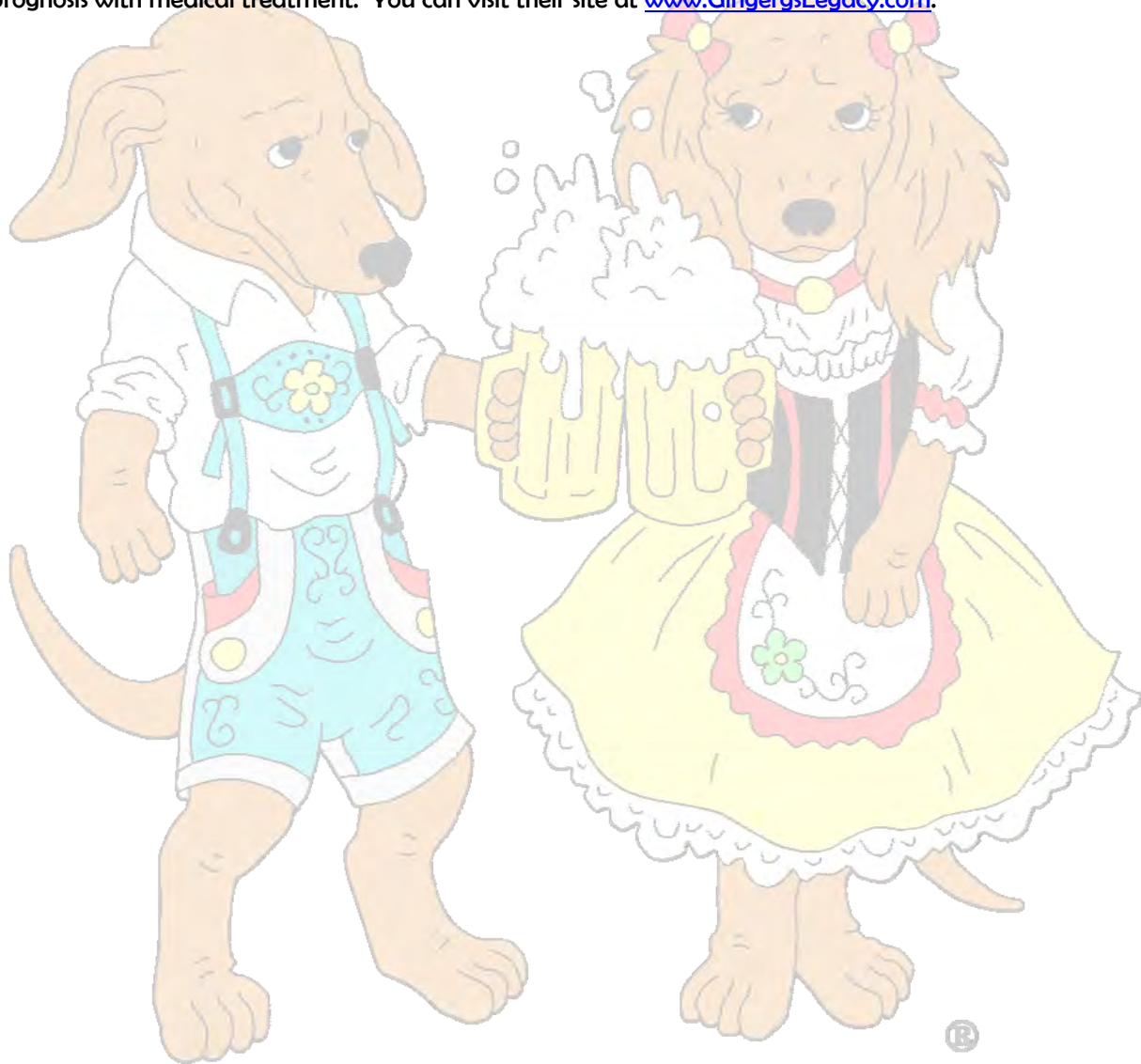
